Narrative:

On December 26, 1997 the writer was instructed by Lt. L. D. Anthony #0053 Car 1601 to proceed to the Med and stand by for a condition report on a shooting victim from 2649 North Hollywood (Crumpys Comedy Club)

At 3:05 A.M. December 26, 1997 Ambulance Unit #20 of the Memphis Fire Department arrived transporting the Victim to Med Trauma. At 3:25 A.M. the writer was informed by Med. Medical Staff that the Victim had received a gun shot wound to the neck entering the left jaw and exited the right side of the neck, approximately 1 to 2 inches above the shoulder. I was further informed that the Victim's spinal cord had been severed as a result of the gun shot wound, with the Victim having paralysis from the neck down. Victim was stabilized and removed to Cat/Scan and X-Ray. Victim listed in Critical Condition at the time of this report.

The writer was informed by Lt. Anthony upon completion of the assignment at the Med, to proceed to the Beale Street Sub Station and interview Officer R. Marshall #5593 who had information regarding the Shooting of the Victim.

Officer Marshall met the writer at the Felony Response Office, where an interview was conducted resulting in the following:

Officer Marshall stated that as he leaving home at (on James Rd, East of Highland) to go to work at the Beale Street Sub Station "A" Shift, he dropped off his Cousin Reginald Lambert (who was visiting from out of town) at Crumpys Comedy Club, located at 2649 North Hollywood. Upon letting his cousin out at the Club, Officer Marshall states he continued to work.

Officer Marshall adds that after completing several calls after leaving roll call, he realized that his Cousin did not have any keys to get back into the apartment after leaving the Club. Officer Marshall secured permission from his Supervisor Lt. Miles Car 605 to take the house keys to his relative at 2649 North Hollywood.

Officer Marshall states that he arrived at the Club at approximately 1:00 and 1:30 A.M. and upon locating his relative at the front entrance; outside the club, gave him the keys. He further added that the Victim was talking to a Male/Black that had been creating a disturbance at the club and the Victim requested a piece of paper from Officer Marshall to write the Male/Black's name and address down for future reference. Officer Marshall further states that the Victim did write the Male/Black's name, address and DOB on the piece of paper and the Victim then placed the piece of paper in his pocket. Officer Marshall adds that the Victim did not request any further assistance and he (Marshall) returned to the Downtown Precinct to his assigned area. Later learning that the Victim had been injured as a result of a gun shot wound.
