THIS IS TO ADVISE YOU THAT THE INSPECTIONAL SERVICES BUREAU OF THE MEMPHIS POLICE DEPARTMENT IS CONDUCTING AN INVESTIGATION INTO: S066-97

Q: Are you aware that this statement is being tape recorded?

A: Yes, I am.

Q: Could you state your full name for the record?

A: Raymond L. Miles.

Q: How long have you been employed with the Memphis Police Department?

A: About twenty three and a half years.

Q: On December 27, 1997, Lt. Miles were you working your regular duty assignment?

A: Yes, I was.

Q: On December 27, were you aware of an incident that transpired at Crumpy's Club at 4629 N. Hollywood?

A: Yes, I was aware.

Q: Did you give Officer Marshall permission to be at the Crumpy Club on that date?

A: I gave him permission to go by there and take some keys, not to be at the club.

Q: Do you know the approximate time?

A: Well, he asked me could he drop those keys off at roll call at twenty three about thirty five hours the previous evening.

Q: In you own words could you tell me the details and the circumstance in which Officer Marshall needed to go to the Crumpy Club?

A: Yes, on that date on the twenty six, we had roll call and after roll call at about twenty three fifty hours, after roll call Officer Marshall advised me that he had dropped his cousin off at the Crump ah Comedy Club out there on his way to work at, at about twenty three hundred hours. And that he realized that he didn't leave these keys with his cousin to get back into ah his house. His cousin was from out of town and was staying with him. And obviously he needed some keys so I gave him permission at that time to go by there and drop those keys back off to his cousin.

Q: Do you know if Officer Marshall got on a special or relayed the information to the dispatcher?

A: Nah, I don't I don't remember.

Q: Did Officer Marshall advise you that it was an incident that transpired with a subject at the Crumpy's Comedy Club while he was there?

A: No, he didn't ah I found out about it through Lt. Arnold. Lt. Arnold called me and advised me that Marshall had been out there and that Marshall could possibly have the ah suspect or perpetrator's name ah for the investigation and advised me to get Marshall or come to the precinct and stay there with him until he got back with me.

Q: When Officer Marshall came back to the precinct with you, did he advise you what had transpire between Officer Williams and the subject at Crumpy's Comedy Club?

A: Ah, yes, he told me that ah there was an altercation where if I am not mistaken I believe he assisted in ah removing a guy from the club. Obviously the suspect and he had wrote the suspect's name down and gave it to Officer Don Williams and he came back to the ah ah precinct where he was assigned.

Q: Do you know if, per your conversation with Officer Marshall was the suspect still on the scene while he was there?

A: Ah, I'm not sure, ah I think all I can really say is that. I believe he told me that he assisted in removing this guy from the club and the other details I didn't discuss it with because Lt. Arnold had him to come to 201 Poplar to the Felony Response Office to give a statement. And actually I didn't talk to Marshall but minutes. I was instructed to have Marshall to come to the officer per radio and I did that. And when I got there Marshall was already there ah approximately two or three minutes later they were calling for him to come downtown to ah head quarters to give that statement.

Q: Lt. Miles is there anything else you would like to add that you feel is relevant in which we have not covered?

A: No, I don't.
